

The Board felt that the logo needed updating, and the new logo encompasses all the attributes of our modern club: "The most prominent element is the square principle mark which represents a defined environment for women to come together. This particular shape imparts strength, structure, and purpose, thus acknowledging the attributes of this long-standing philanthropic organization. The embedded "W" represents all that all are welcome. In using an embellished letterform, we convey the feminine traits that are intrinsic to the Club.

The position of the letterform extends beyond the boundaries (of the Club) flowing out to the surrounding community – representing "reaching out, providing support, and serving others." At the same time, the curve creates an encompassing flow that provides a sense of coming together within a welcoming space that fosters friendships. A contemporary font for the signature. combined with a fresh color palette (bright green and deep blue), presents a more current and progressive image that is in keeping with the essence of the Wilton Woman's Club.
